The regular season will resume January 3rd, 2025, and Esso Minor Hockey Week (EMHW) commences on January 10th, 2025. We would like to wish all our teams the best of luck this year in EMHW, and we hope that everyone has fun, celebrates some wins, and brings home some banners!

Frequently Asked Questions with Esso Minor Hockey Week:

Do the EMHW games count towards our regular season standings?

The first game of EMHW is the first game of the tournament but is also considered a regular season game and it will count towards you regular season standings. All subsequent games after game 1 are tournament games.

What happens if there is a tie at the end of the game?

If after regulation time a non-championship game remains tied, the teams will proceed to a shootout. During a championship game, if the score is tied at the end of regulation, a three-minute, 3-on-3, sudden victory overtime period shall be played.

What happens if the referees don't show up?

In the unlikely event that referees do not show up during EMHW, Hockey Calgary asks that coaches bring their skates, helmets, and a whistle to the game to step in as an emergency referee. Please note that this is only permitted during EMHW and City Championships in the event of an emergency, not for any other sanctioned games throughout the year.

If our team is successful and wins the championship game what does our team win?

Hockey Calgary provides all EMHW Champions with a banner, a medal, and the opportunity to purchase a EMHW Championship Hoodie through Hockey Calgary if they chose.

IN LOVING MEMORY OF SAMUEL NLEYA

October 18, 2007 - November 21, 2024

On Thursday, November 21, 2024 the Raiders tragically lost a U18 player. As you read through this please take a moment to honour our fallen teammate, mentor, and friend.

Samuel Nleya (Sam to his hockey team) was the Assistant Captain for the U18 NBC 2 Black team. After being born in Calgary, Sam's passion for hockey started in 2009, when his family moved to Fort McMurray. He learned how to skate and play the game which he quickly fell in love with; as we all have. Hockey was a big part of Samuel's life. In addition to being a Raider, Sam was a referee, a skating coach and mentor to younger children at Vivo, and worked at the Saddledome for many Flames games and other events. When Sam was 16 years old, he was the recipient of a government grant to facilitate, organize and lead a program in the off-season to teach players of colour how to skate and play hockey. A

remarkable accomplishment for a 16 year old.

The dedication, commitment, and passion that Sam had towards our game speaks volumes towards the person that he was. Sam was a leader, a goal achiever, and a student who had a brilliant mind. His legacy will live on in all the people that his life touched including his previous teammates, his current team, his coaches, and anyone that had the privilege of knowing him.

Rest in peace Samuel and thank you for all that you brought to Simons Valley, the Raiders and the game of hockey. You will be greatly missed.


CRHC COMMUNICATION PROCESS
